May's topic is "The Venezuelan Conundrum: Two Views on U.S. Policy" with Ambassador William Brownfield, Senior Adviser (Non-resident), Americas Program, CSIS; and The Honorable Mark Feierstein, Senior Advisor, Albright Stone Bridge Group's Americas practice.

Ambassador William (Bill) Brownfield enjoyed an illustrious career in public service, at the rank of career ambassador, the highest rank in the U.S. Foreign Service. Amb. Brownfield's last seven years of his career were spent serving as the assistant secretary of state for the bureau of international narcotics and law enforcement affairs. As assistant secretary, Amb. Brownfield ran a portfolio of more than \$4 billion in 80 countries administered by 5000 employees and contractors. Amb. Brownfield's expertise in the Americas draws from his vast experience in serving as U.S. ambassador to Chile, Venezuela, and Colombia. Through his ambassadorial posts, Amb. Brownfield was immersed in working with the Colombian government to build upon existing institutions and promoting U.S. interests economically via the establishment of the Chile-United States Free Trade Agreement. In Venezuela, he led an embassy in constant crisis with the most adversarial government of any country in the Hemisphere. Brownfield has UN experience in Geneva and Vienna. He was temporary political adviser to the U.S. Southern Command. He received the Secretary's Distinguished Service Award and the Presidential Performance Award three times each. He is a graduate of Cornell University and the National War College and attended the University of Texas School of Law. He speaks Spanish and French.

Mark Feierstein is a senior advisor with the Albright Stonebridge Group, the U.S. Institute of Peace and GBAO and a consultant to Major League Baseball.

Mark has served more than three decades at senior levels in the public and private sectors. In government, he has been senior director for Western Hemisphere affairs and special assistant to the president on the National Security Council, acting deputy administrator as well as assistant administrator for Latin America and the Caribbean at USAID, and acting deputy chief of mission for the U.S. Mission to the Organization of American States.

Outside government, Mark has been a principal at a polling firm, director for Latin America at the National Democratic Institute, and a journalist in Mexico and the United States. Mark has published in numerous newspapers and journals on U.S. foreign policy and Latin American politics.

Mark has a bachelor's in international relations from Tufts University and a master's in international affairs from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy. He is fluent in Spanish.

In Pakistan and American Diplomacy, volume #75 in the Diplomats and Diplomacy Series, former senior U.S. embassy and State Department official Ted Craig offers the detailed insights of an American diplomat who participated in key episodes in U.S.-Pakistan relations since 2010. His astute, fast-moving diplomatic tour de force includes unsparing assessments of U.S. and Pakistani policy mistakes that fueled the long Afghan war and its disappointing end.

"Ted Craig's book is packed with the wisdom of a professional diplomat, its pages peppered with insights won through tours of high-pressure diplomacy in Islamabad. In the 2019 Cricket World Cup, as Pakistan squared off against key neighbors (Afghanistan, India, Bangladesh) and its former colonial ruler (Britain), Craig used each chapter to foreground a major issue in U.S.-Pakistan diplomacy. He also examined the excitement and ultimate disappointment accompanying the rise to power of former cricket star Imran Khan.

Ted Craig's twenty-nine-year career in the U.S. Foreign Service included two tours in Islamabad, Pakistan, the second as Political Counselor. He holds a master's degree from the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies and taught as a Fellow at Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service. His service also included three tours in Latin America, a tour on the secretary of state's Policy Planning Staff, and policy jobs on peace and security, the global environment, and human rights. He is currently a senior program advisor for the State Department's Bureau of Counterterrorism, serving in South and Central Asia.

"Why was there no warning of this?" "No planning, ... just in case?" "What is the strategy here?"

How often do questions like these arise when an unexpected event brings on a bloody conflict and voices from all sides are calling for contenting powers and stakeholders to effect a satisfactory outcome?

The Salon will ponder these and related issues when it meets on Tuesday evening, April 23. Providing the scene-setter for the discussion will be Michael Dziedzic.

Michael Dziedzic is a retired Colonel whose career blended the worlds of theory and practice in the realm of peacekeeping and stability operations. His field experience included postings in El Salvador, Bosnia, Kosovo, and Afghanistan. His publications have shaped the way the U.S. approaches peace and stability operations. Notably, Quest for Viable Peace proposed that "conflict transformation" is the essence of the transition from war to sustainable peace. This concept was adopted by the State Department's as the paradigm for U.S. strategic planning and was incorporated into the US Army Field Manual on Stability Operations. Dr. Dziedzic currently is a Senior Fellow for Combatting Criminalized Power Structures and Elite at the Alliance for Peacebuilding. A fuller biography is given below.

To be sure, no single individual or actor with a vital stake in a crisis is likely to have a simple or ready-made solution for violent conflicts that seem to burst on the scene. Perhaps, that is just the point. One-sided courses-of-action are not framed to address multi-sided interests and rights.

Colonel Dziedzic will invite participants in the Salon to consider and discuss:

Models and examples of planning processes to guide actors when contingencies arise and action is required. Are these flexible enough to adapt to changing events in the field?;

Lessons learned from the management – or mis-management -- of earlier crises. What do they teach us? recommend? Is it misleading, from the outset, to think of crises as something for managers, like MBAs, to handle?

The role diplomacy plays in conjunction with strategy before, during, and after crises? Does each have its "own lane to travel" or is a "whole of government" approach advisable from start to finish?

The Salon, as previous participants understand, is not a "How-to" Information-Transfer Exercise. Invitees from DACOR and their guests will likely have been involved in one or more crises or aspects of of a crisis in their careers. All attending the Salon are invited to share their pertinent experiences and voice their doubts, actively listen and constructively question.

Michael Dziedzic is a retired Colonel whose career blended the worlds of theory and

practice in the realm of peacekeeping and stability operations. His field experience included postings in El Salvador, Bosnia, Kosovo, and Afghanistan. His publications include works that have shaped the way the U.S. approaches peace and stability operations. Policing the New World Disorder identified a recurring "public security gap" which led to the creation of the Center of Excellence for Stability Police Units. Quest for Viable Peace proposed that "conflict transformation" is the essence of the transition from war to sustainable peace, and this concept was adopted by the State Department's Coordinator for Reconstruction and Stabilization as the paradigm for U.S. strategic planning and was incorporated into the US Army Field Manual 3-07 on Stability Operations. His most recent publications, Criminalized Power Structures: The Overlooked Enemies of Peace and Combating Criminalized Power Structures: A Toolkit, provide empirical evidence that criminalized power structures are the predominant spoilers of peace and stability operations and propose strategies for dealing with them. He currently is a Senior Fellow for Combatting Criminalized Power Structures and Elite Capture at the Alliance for Peacebuilding.
